3rd SUNDAY of ADVENT

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near

Today, the third Sunday of Advent, the Church celebrates Gaudete Sunday. The dour violet of Advent gives way to the brighter colour of rose as she looks forward in joy to the birth of our Lord.

The word *gaudete* comes from the Latin word *gaudere* meaning "to rejoice" because the Mass today opens with the words "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice."

The season of Advent originated as a fast of forty days in preparation for Christmas, commencing on the day after the feast of St. Martin (11 November), when it was often called "St. Martin's Lent"—a name by which it was known as early as the fifth century. In the ninth century, the duration of Advent was reduced to four weeks, and Advent preserved most of the characteristics of a penitential season which made it a kind of counterpart to Lent. Gaudete Sunday is a counterpart to Laetare Sunday, and provides a similar break about midway through a season which is otherwise of a penitential character, and signifies the nearness of the Lord's coming.

The spirit of the Mass all through Advent is one of expectation and preparation for the feast of Christmas as well as for the second coming of Christ, and the penitential exercises suitable to that spirit are suspended on Gaudete Sunday to symbolise that joy and gladness in the promised Redemption.

While the theme of Advent is a focus on the coming of Jesus in three ways: His first, His present and His

final Advent, the readings for Gaudete Sunday deal with rejoicing in the Lord—Christian joy—as well as the mission of St. John the Baptist and his connection with Advent.

There is a difference between happiness and joy. While happiness is dependent on external conditions, joy is the experience of knowing that you are unconditionally loved and that nothing can take that love away. Thus joy can be present even in the midst of sadness.

In his 2014 Gaudete Sunday homily, Pope Francis said that Gaudete Sunday is known as the "Sunday of joy," and that instead of fretting about "all they still haven't" done to prepare for Christmas, people should "think of all the good things life has given you."



#### **N.S.W.** Government Public **Health Restrictions** from 15 December

From Wednesday, 15 December, the N.S.W. Government public health restrictions will be amended.

Face masks will no longer be required in churches but be highly recommended. Checking-in by use of the government QR code or by manually completing the sign-in sheets will remain mandatory for churches. Whilst it will no longer be required for other places, such as shops, the government has stated that it will remain in place for places of worship.

Please be aware that if you do not check-in on arrival that the N.S.W. Government can impose fines on individuals. N.S.W. Police and N.S.W. Health officials may conduct spot checks on individuals to ensure compliance.

- 1. Download the Service NSW app
- 2. Select "Covid Safe Check-in"
- **3.** Follow the prompts

'Prepare a Way!' is an Advent resource designed to assist the reader set aside some time each day throughout the 4 weeks of Advent to reflect and allow the grace of this holy season to be ingrained into our daily lives. The resource offers daily reflections including antiphons, scripture and prayer.

The resource also makes use of the '*O* Antiphons' 7 in total, traditionally prayed in the 7 days leading to the Solemnity of Christmas. These Antiphons have been described as a "unique work of art...filled with the Spirit of the Word of God."

This resource is ideal for families, who may wish to meditate on each day in a family setting by sharing around the readings or alternatively for individuals seeking an exercise to help them further contemplate on the season by spending quiet time in solitude and prayer to focus deeper on each day's scripture.

It is hoped that this resource will help add an extra layer of prayer to your personal preparation for Christmas.

#### PRACTICAL TIPS FOR A SPIRITUALLY NOURISHING ADVENT

- Attend Sunday Mass
- Acts of Good Works (Almsgiving in support of the church and in support of those in need),
- \* Fast one day each week or fast from one meal
- \* Seek the Sacrament of Penance (Confession)
- \* Add a Weekday Mass to your spiritual devotions
- Attend the December First Friday of the Month Devotions (including Adoration)
- \* Attend the December Traditional Latin Mass
- \* Pray the Holy Rosary in your homes as a family
- Set up a prayer space in your home which can help to focus thoughts on Advent
- Create or set up an Advent wreath in your home and light a candle each week of Advent
- Pray daily for the Souls of the Faithful Departed, the Holy Souls in Purgatory and all Forgotten Souls.
- Pray for Persecuted Christians who are forbidden from celebrating Christmas.
- Pray the Litany of St. Joseph
- Set up a nativity scene in your homes

#### The Readings

#### Introit (Phil 4:4-5)

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.

#### **First Reading The Prophet Zephaniah** (3:14-18)

Shout for joy, daughter of Zion, Israel, shout aloud! Rejoice, exult with all your heart, daughter of Jerusalem! The Lord has repealed your sentence; he has driven your enemies away. The Lord, the king of Israel, is in your midst; you have no more evil to fear. When that day comes, word will come to Jerusalem: Zion, have no fear, do not let your hands fall limp. The Lord your God is in your midst, a victorious warrior. He will exult with joy over you, he will renew you by his love; he will dance with shouts of joy for you as on a day of festival.

#### Responsorial Psalm (Is 12:2-6. R. v. 6)

R. Cry out with joy and gladness: for among you is the great and Holy One of Israel.

Truly, God is my salvation, I trust, I shall not fear. For the Lord is my strength, my song, he became my saviour. With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation. R.

Give thanks to the Lord, give praise to his name! Make his mighty deeds known to the peoples! Declare the greatness of his name. R.

Sing a psalm to the Lord for he has done glorious deeds, make them known to all the earth! People of Zion, sing and shout for joy for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel. R.

#### Second Reading The Letter of St. Paul to the Philippians (4:4-7)

I want you to be happy, always happy in the Lord; I repeat, what I want is your happiness. Let your tolerance be evident to everyone: the Lord is very near. There is no need to worry; but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and

that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus.

#### Gospel Acclamation (Is 61:1)

Alleluia, alleluia! The Spirit of the Lord is upon me; he sent me to bring Good News to the poor. Alleluia!

#### Gospel of Luke (3:10-18)

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

#### Communio (Cf. Is 35:4)

Say to the faint of heart: Be strong and do not fear. Behold, our God will come, and he will save us.

#### "Gaudete in Domino semper: iterum dico, gaudete."

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice." *Philemon 4:4-5*
