SHROVETTUESDAY

In Australia and Britain the day preceding Ash Wednesday is popularly known as Shrove Tuesday. It is also frequently called Pancake Tuesday or Fat Tuesday as well as by its Latin name, *Mardi Gras*, which when translated from the French also means "Fat Tuesday."

But it is the name "Shrove" that shows its religious origins. Shrove is the past tense of the English verb "to shrive" which means to obtain absolution for our sins by confession and penance.

Dating back to A.D. 1000, over the years Shrove Tuesday not only became a day for Confession but a time for Catholics to feast on eggs, sugar and dairy which are traditionally restricted during the Lenten fast. X

Not only was Shrove Tuesday a last chance to gorge on such foods but it was also a way to use them up before the fast began.

In Britain the feast of these foods would become pancakes, hence the name Pancake Tuesday. The idea of Pancake Tuesday to celebrate the eve of the Lenten Fast gathered momentum in the Middle Ages in England with pancake races and pancake tossing, traditions which remain in certain villages and towns to this day.

With Shrove Tuesday taking place before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday, it is a reminder and an encouragement to go to confession during that penitential season that will end 40 days and 40 nights later with Easter Sunday.

Ash Wednesday Holy Mass Times

There will be a total of 5 Masses said on Ash Wednesday, allowing all parishioners to be able to attend Mass and to receive the imposition of ashes as we begin the holy season of Lent.

The times for these Masses are listed in the following pages of this bulletin, as well as on our Facebook page, Instagram page, website, and parish app.

Please be aware that the Sacrament of Penance (confessions) will not be available on Wednesday evening due to the additional evening Mass for Ash Wednesday. Confessions will be available on Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. at Holy Trinity Church and will resume the following Wednesday from 6:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at Holy Family Church.

Sacrament of Confirmation Enrolment Applications

The Mass for the conferral of the Sacrament of Confirmation will be said on Thursday, 28 July at 7:00 p.m. at Holy Family Church.

Applications for enrolments are available for parishioners and those who attend Holy Mass in the parish each week.

To be eligible for enrolment, you must attend Mass each week in the parish, your child must be in year 5 or above and have been Baptised in the Roman Catholic Church (those Baptised in Eastern Catholic Churches such as the Maronites received the Sacrament of Confirmation at the time of Baptism).

Applications for enrolment in the Sacrament are available after Mass each day and the forms must be returned with the Baptism certificate to Fr. Andrew at Mass either on Sundays or during the week.

Shrove Tuesday Burning of Palms and Burial of the Alleluia and Pancake Supper

This Tuesday we celebrate Shrove Tuesday, and we will be holding our annual Burning of the Palms and Holy Oils and Burial of the Alleluia followed by a pancake supper.

Shrove Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednesday, is traditionally marked by the preparation of the ashes for the next day, the burial of the Alleluia for the season of Lent, and the cooking pancakes to use up eggs, sugar and dairy products before the fast of Lent begins.

The palms blessed the previous year on Palm Sunday are burned, along with the holy oils used in the Sacraments, to form the ashes which are then imposed on people's heads on Ash Wednesday as a mark of penance. The "Alleluia" is buried to mark the fact that this word is never spoken during Lent.

Join us on Shrove Tuesday at Holy Family Church for Holy Mass at 6:00 p.m. and followed by the burning of palms and the holy oils and the burial of the Alleluia.

If you can help by preparing pancakes to be brought for our pancake supper, please speak with Fr. Andrew.

Temporary Mass Times

The temporary Mass times introduced to assist parishioners to attend Mass during the pandemic will continue for the time being, but with the easing of government public health restrictions, consideration will be given as to whether these times are still needed. Currently, there are 9 Masses offered across the weekend and, in Lent, there are a total of at least 18 Masses throughout the week.

The Readings

Introit (Cf. Ps. 17:19-20)

The Lord became my protector. He brought me out to a place of freedom; he saved me because he delighted in me.

First Reading The Book of Ecclesiasticus

(27:4-7)

In a shaken sieve the rubbish is left behind, so too the defects of a man appear in his talk. The kiln tests the work of the potter, the test of a man is in his conversation. The orchard where the tree grows is judged on the quality of its fruit, similarly a man's words betray what he feels. Do not praise a man before he has spoken, since this is the test of men.

Responsorial Psalm

(Ps. 91:2-3, 13-16. R. see v. 2)

R. Lord, it is good to give thanks to you.

It is good to give thanks to the Lord to make music to your name, O Most High, to proclaim your love in the morning and your truth in the watches of the night. R.

The just will flourish like the palm-tree and grow like a Lebanon cedar. R.

Gospel of Luke (6:39-45)

How can you say to your brother, "Brother, let me take out the splinter that is in your eye," when you cannot see the plank in your own? Hypocrite! 'There is no sound tree that produces rotten fruit, nor again a rotten tree that produces sound fruit.
