THE MONTH of the IMMACULATE HEART of MARY

In the visions of Fatima on July 13, 1917, Mary told the children "to save poor sinners, God wishes to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart."

In a series of visions in 1925 and 1926, the oldest of the visionaries, Lucia Dos Santos, received a further message from Mary asking that the five first Saturdays be devoted to help make amends for the offences committed against her heart by man's blasphemies and ingratitude.

In 1942, the war prophesied by Mary raged through Europe and the Church celebrated the 25th anniversary of the original visions at Fatima. That same year Pope Pius XII consecrated the Church and the whole world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and established the Feast of the Immaculate Heart to fall on August 22 during the Octave of the Assumption.

Following Vatican II the feast day was moved to the Saturday following the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

On May, 13, 1982, Pope John Paul II consecrated the world to Our Lady of Fatima and to her Immaculate Heart with these words he said in prayer: "Oh, Immaculate Heart! Help us to conquer the menace of evil, which so easily takes root in the hearts of the people of today, and whose immeasurable effects already weigh down upon our modern world and seem to block the paths towards the future! Let there be revealed, once more, in the history of the world your infinite power of merciful love. May it put a stop to evil. May it transform consciences. May your Immaculate Heart reveal for all the light of hope."

First Thursday Holy Mass in Latin

This Thursday, being the first Thursday of the month, Holy Mass in Latin will be said at Holy Trinity Church at 6:00 p.m.

The first Thursday of the month is traditionally offered as an act of reparation to the wounds of Our Lord and in honour of the Blessed Sacrament. It is also offered as day to pray for Priests in honour of Our Lord Jesus Christ, High and Eternal Priest.

First Friday Devotions in Honour of the Sacred Heart

This Friday, being the first Friday of the month, we continue our devotions in honour of the Sacred Heart of Our Lord and in reparation for our sins and for the sins of humanity.

At Holy Trinity Church, beginning with confessions at 6:15 p.m., there will then be the Holy Rosary at 6:30 p.m., followed by Holy Mass at 7:00 p.m. and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at 7:30 p.m.

Join us for these devotions in honour of Our Lord and for the grace of His Sacraments, especially in this Easter season and as a way to fulfill the paschal precept, which is to make your confession and to receive Holy Communion during the season of Easter.

Important Notice

Holy Mass on Sunday, 11 September at 3:00 p.m., which is itself a temporary Mass time, will not be said so as to allow the Vietnamese community to celebrate Mass in honour of St. Joseph Hang Long Canh.

The Mass at this time, although continuing to be a temporary time, will resume the following week.

Eucharistic Miracle of

MORNE-ROUGE, MARTINIQUE

On May 8, 1902, La Montagne, the volcano at the peak of Mount Pelée suddenly erupted. A discharge of lava reached the city of Saint-Pierre de la Martinique and completely destroyed it. That day, the eruption mysteriously spared the village of Morne-Rouge, located between Saint-Pierre and Mount Pelée. The prodigious event was accompanied by an apparition of Jesus and His Sacred Heart in the Host exposed for public Eucharistic adoration. There were many witnesses to that extraordinary phenomenon.

On May 8, 1902, Ascension Day, the Mount Pelée volcano started erupting lava and ashes. The inhabitants of Morne-Rouge, strongly devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, immediately hurried to their parish church to ask Our Lady of Deliverance to spare their village from catastrophe.

At that moment of sudden danger, people rushed to the confessionals. The Parish Priest, Fr. Mary, gave a general absolution to all the faithful, distributed Holy Communion, and then exposed the Blessed Sacrament for public adoration. At a certain point, a woman cried out, "The Sacred Heart of Jesus is in the Host!" A large number of people witnessed







the apparition of Jesus in the Host, showing His Sacred Heart crowned with thorns. Some declared they also saw the Precious Blood of Jesus dripping from His Sacred Heart.

The vision lasted several hours and stopped only after the reposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle. On May 8, the village of Morne-Rouge was spared from the volcano's devastating fury. Therefore, the local population had a chance to reconcile themselves with God, receive the sacraments, and so be prepared to die in the state of grace. On August 30 of the same year, a violent eruption of the same volcano destroyed the village of Morne-Rouge.

Office for Safeguarding

As announced a number of times previously, the Diocese of Parramatta has made it mandatory for all volunteers in parishes to undertake training for the sake of collective responsibility and for the means of identifying children and adults at risk.

Religious organisations are required by law to ensure their volunteers who are involved in ministries that may directly or indirectly come in contact with children and adults at risk have undertaken mandatory safeguarding training.

As such, all staff and volunteers of the Diocese of Parramatta, including parishes, chaplaincies, deanery and diocesan ministries and councils, who work with children and adults at risk are required to complete mandatory safeguarding training with the intention of protecting those identified as vulnerable.

The Diocese of Parramatta has arranged for a series of safeguarding training modules to be undertaken, online or face to face.

All training is constantly updated to meet the Office of the Children's Guardian Child Safe Standards, the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards, and the Diocese of Parramatta Safeguarding Policy.

For most volunteers, the training will require four hours. Once completed, the certification of completion of the mandatory training will be valid for two years.

Mandatory "Safeguarding Training" for All Parish Volunteers

For those who would like to complete the training independently on the online training platform can start these modules at any time and complete them at your own pace. To register and to complete the necessary training modules, visit learning.safeguarding.org.au. You can then sign up with your email address and enrol in the three compliance modules (tagged in yellow). For those who would prefer to complete the modules face to face, the parish has arranged for training to be offered across two days in November in MacKillop Hall.

There will be two sessions, both of which must be attended. The first of the two sessions will be held on Saturday, November 12 from 9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and the second of the two sessions on Saturday, November 19 from 9:00 a.m to 11:30 a.m.

These sessions will allow participants to complete the three mandatory safeguarding modules: "Understanding Safeguarding and the Child Safe Standards," "Legal Compliance and Safeguarding: Risk of Significant Harm and Mandatory Reporting," and "Safeguarding Adults at Risk and Understanding Boundaries."

Introit (Cf. Ps. 85:3, 5)

Second Reading The Letter to the Hebrews (12:18-19, 22-24)

What you have come to is nothing known to the senses: not a blazing fire, or a gloom turning to total darkness, or a storm; or trumpeting thunder or the great voice speaking which made everyone that heard it beg that no more should be said to them. But what you have come to is Mount Zion and the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem where the millions of angels have gathered for the festival, with the whole Church in which everyone is a 'first-born son' and a citizen of heaven. You have come to God himself, the supreme Judge, and been placed with spirits of the saints who have been made perfect; and to Jesus, the mediator who brings a new covenant.

Gospel Acclamation (Mt. 11:29)

Alleluia, alleluia! Take my yoke upon you; learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart. Alleluia!

Gospel of Luke (14:1, 7-14)

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.' Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
