Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

There is a story that St. Augustine was walking on the beach contemplating the mystery of the Trinity. He saw a boy in front of him who had dug a hole in the sand and was going out to the sea again and again and bringing some water to pour into the hole. St. Augustine asked him, "What are you doing?" "I'm going to pour the entire ocean into this hole." "That is impossible, the whole ocean will not fit in the hole you have made," said St. Augustine. The boy replied, "And you cannot fit the Trinity in your tiny little brain. The story ends by saying that the boy vanished because the person St. Augustine had been talking to was an angel.

The Trinity is hard to understand. It is a mystery but we should not be afraid to engage with the mystery. It is a matter of faith, but God also gave us reason which means we can delve deeper into our faith.

The Trinity is all around us, every day. We are Baptised in



the name of the Most Holy Trinity—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. When we make the sign of the Cross we make it in the name of the Trinity. We do it before praying so that we may put ourselves spiritually in order; focus thoughts, heart and will on God; after praying, so that what God has given us may remain within us. It embraces the whole being, body and soul and everything is consecrated in the name of the Triune God. When we pray we are praying to God our Father through God the Son by the power given to us to pray by God the Holy Spirit.

And today as we celebrate a feast day of our parish, let us pray that we will be granted the grace of faith and understanding.

So let us pray on this feast day, "Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen."

The annual volunteer drive which we launched last Sunday on the Solemnity of Pentecost continues this week. We are calling, again, on parishioners to take part in the life of the parish. We are also calling on parishioners to volunteer at Holy Family Church as organists, pianists and cantors, to volunteer to arrange for collectors at each Mass, to volunteer to assist in the piety shop, to volunteer to assist in serving at the altar.

There are many ways to get involved and we encourage all parishioners to get involved and to serve the parish as a volunteer in one or many ways.

Diocese of Parramatta's Safe Parishes Week Mandatory Safeguarding Training for All Parish Volunteers in All Parishes of the Diocese

"Building Safe Parishes Together in 2023": an update from the Diocese of Parramatta's Office for Safeguarding.

Are you new to parish volunteering this year and have not completed your safeguarding training? Are you an existing volunteer and have not yet completed your six points of mandatory safeguarding training?

Under the Children's Guardian Act 2019 and the N.S.W. Child Safe Standards all volunteers in parishes are mandatory reporters and are required to have completed their safeguarding training. The Office of the Children's Guardian expects all volunteers in parishes have now met this standard.

The Diocese of Parramatta has zero tolerance for abuse, and therefore commits to keeping children safe as well as all adults at risk.

You are now invited to register for the mandatory six points of safeguarding training. To complete cycle 1, register for the mandatory training during "Safe Parishes Week" on Friday, 9 June from 9.30 a.m. to 2.30 p.m. at the Bishop Bede Heather Centre, 1-5 Marion St., Blacktown by emailing safeguardingtraining@parracatholic.org.



The sense that vestments are sacred, that they should be beautiful, and that they should add majesty to the celebration is found, firstly, in the Bible: "The Lord clothed [Aaron] with splendid apparel and adorned him with the glorious sacred vestments... majestic, glorious, renowned for splendour, a delight to the eyes, beauty supreme. Before him, no one was adorned with these, nor may they ever be worn by any except his sons and them alone, generation after generation, for all time." (Eccles. 45:8, 10, 12-13).

Thank you to the Zaiter family for their gift, and may they and all who support the Church be blessed for their generosity.

The Readings
