On Thursday we celebrate the Memorial of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary who, after her Assumption body and soul into heaven, was crowned Queen of Heaven. And we celebrated, also, the feast day of our Sisters, the Congregation of the Missionary Sisters of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Queen of the World—Australia.

In A.D. 1954 Pope Venerable Pius XII spoke about the Queenship of Mary in his encyclical, *Ad Caeli Reginum*, and taught that as her Son is proclaimed Prince of Peace, King of Kings, and Lord of Lords so she is honoured as Queen of Heaven because of the intimate connection that lies between a mother and a son

From the annunciation of the Archangel Gabriel when Our Lady sang in the Magnificat: "From this day all generations will call me blessed," and the Visitation and the greeting of Elizabeth who said, "why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord," the Church has recognised this singular honour granted to her.

Let us glory in being subjects of the Virgin Mother of God, who, while wielding royal power, is on fire with a mother's love.

And let us pray not only for ourselves but also for our Sisters in the words of St. Ephrem: "Majestic and Heavenly Maid, Lady, Queen, protect and keep me under your wing lest Satan the sower of destruction glory over me, lest my wicked foe be victorious against me."





Saints STUFF

St. Genesius



There is a patron saint for everything and everyone, even clowns. And that's St. Genesius, a Roman martyr of the 3rd century.

In his earlier life he was a comedian and actor who performed in plays that mocked Christianity. According to legend, while performing in a play that made fun of baptism, he had an experience on stage that converted him. He proclaimed his new belief, and he steadfastly refused to renounce it, even when the emperor Diocletian ordered him to do so.

He is also the patron saint of actors, comedians, and lawyers. His feast day is 25th August.

CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

The Blessed Virgin Mary

971 "All generations will call me blessed": "The Church's devotion to the Blessed Virgin is intrinsic to Christian worship." The Church rightly honours "the Blessed Virgin with special devotion. From the most ancient times the Blessed Virgin has been honoured with the title of 'Mother of God,' to whose protection the faithful fly in all their dangers and needs.

This very special devotion differs essentially from the adoration which is given to the incarnate Word and equally to the Father and the Holy Spirit, and greatly fosters this adoration." The liturgical feasts dedicated to the Mother of God and Marian prayer, such as the rosary, an "epitome of the whole Gospel," express this devotion to the Virgin Mary.

972 In [Mary] we contemplate what the Church already is in her mystery on her own "pilgrimage of faith," and what she will be in the homeland at the end of her journey. There, "in the glory of the Most Holy and Undivided Trinity," "in the communion of all the saints," the Church is awaited by the one she venerates as Mother of her Lord and as her own mother.

Why the Devil Hates Mary

The Italian Priest, Fr. Sante Babolin, a renowned exorcist who has performed more than 2,300 exorcisms, said that "as proof of this hatred" of the devil toward the Mother of God, "while I was insistently invoking the Most Holy Virgin Mary, the devil answered me: 'I can't stand That One (Mary) any more and neither can I stand you any more.'"

Fr. Babolin pointed out the passage in the book of Genesis (3:15) — which is evoked in the Rite of Exorcism — where God says to the serpent that "she will crush your head." In this ritual, he said, the exorcist says to the devil:

"Most cunning serpent, you shall no more dare to deceive the human race, persecute the Church, torment God's elect and sift them as wheat... The sacred Sign of the Cross commands you, as does also the power of the mysteries of the Christian Faith... The glorious Mother of God, the Virgin Mary, commands you; she who by her humility and from the first moment of her Immaculate Conception crushed your proud head."

The Readings

Introit (Ps. 83:10-11)

Turn your eyes, O God, our shield; and look on the face of your anointed one; one day within your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere.

First Reading The Book of Proverbs (9:1-6)

Wisdom has built herself a house, she has erected her seven pillars, she has slaughtered her beasts, prepared her wine, she has laid her table.

She has despatched her maidservants and proclaimed from the city's heights: 'Who is ignorant? Let him step this way.'

To the fool she says, 'Come and eat my bread, drink the wine I have prepared!

Leave your folly and you will live, walk in the ways of perception.'

Responsorial Psalm (*Ps.* 33:2-3, 10-15. R. v. 9)

R. Taste and see the goodness of the Lord.

I will bless the Lord at all times, his praise always on my lips; in the Lord my soul shall make its boast. The humble shall hear and be glad. R.

Revere the Lord, you his saints.

They lack nothing, those who revere him.

Strong lions suffer want and go hungry but those who seek the Lord lack no blessing. R.

Come children, and hear me that I may teach you the fear of the Lord. Who is he who longs for life and many days, to enjoy his prosperity? R.

Then keep your tongue from evil and your lips from speaking deceit. Turn aside from evil and do good; seek and strive after peace. R.

Second Reading The Letter of St. Paul to the Ephesians (5:15-20)

Be very careful about the sort of lives you lead, like intelligent and not like senseless people. This may be a wicked age, but your lives should redeem it. And do not be thoughtless but recognise what is the will of the Lord. Do not drug yourselves with wine, this is simply dissipation; be filled with the Spirit. Sing the words and tunes of the psalms and hymns when you are together,

and go on singing and chanting to the Lord in your hearts, so that always and everywhere you are giving thanks to God who is our Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel Acclamation (Jn. 6:56)

Alleluia, alleluia! All who eat my flesh and drink my blood live in me and I in them, says the Lord. Alleluia!

Gospel The Gospel of John (6:51-58)

Jesus said to the crowd: 'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied: 'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'
